OPERATIONS PLAN 88-1

BIKINI WETO SURVEY

I. BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

In 1986 a program directed to the eventual return and clean-up of Bikini Atoll was initiated by DOI and supported by DOE through their existing Pacific Operations Contract.

In August of 1986 an engineering group from Holmes & Narver, Inc. and the Bikinian Planning Council conducted a fact finding mission to Bikini Atoll with the support of DOE/PASO and their contractor's Field Station Staff. The results of their efforts a "Conceptual Design Report" was issued in November 1986. A subsequent trip was initiated in April 1987 to bring the landowners to Eneu to establish weto lines, to do preliminary geothermal studies and to refine the "Conceptual Design Report". A revised report was used in January 1987.

The work for FY '88, which will be supported by DOE/PASO through their contractor Holmes & Narver, Inc., will consist of a Weto Line Survey (outlined in this Ops Plan) and a Fertilizing Program at Eneu which should start in January 1988.

II. RESPONSIBILITIES

a) Administration and Support

The Department of Energy, through its integrated contractor, Holmes & Narver, Inc., operates a base camp on the island of Bikini, a satellite camp at Eneu, and a 135 foot seagoing vessel based at Kwajalein which can be assigned to support missions in the field.

The DOE authority during field missions will be exercised by a Field Representative or, in his absence, by a Senior Holmes & Narver Representative, who will be responsible for overall coordination and administration in support of the users, and direction of all logistical management activities, including communication and safety. Day to day camp administration will be provided by H&N Site Manager.

To identify, mark and record all Weto Lines on Bikini.
